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the time. I realize that change in the third-person is always easier than change in the first-person. 'Their changing is good.' Versus... 'My changing scares the stuffings out of me.' My July 7th message will introduce my theme for us moving forward. It's called, "Our Future Is Now". You are going to hear that we cannot wait for tomorrow to begin moving forward. Many churches are either in decline or stagnant. How will we engage the opportunity to move the church of God forward? How will we honor the decisions of our parent denomination by becoming a more open and inclusive church? How will we be willing to change ourselves and how we 'do church', to become a place where people come to develop a meaningful relationship with the Divine – realizing that those coming in our doors will likely not look like us or act like us? How are your feelings of fear, trepidation, angst, and uneasiness now!? Or do these opportunities bring forth excitement, anticipation, readiness, and willingness.

Doing church today is nothing like how we did church 20 years ago, ten years ago, or even five years ago. Our music has changed and evolved. How we pray has become more broad. Meaningful worship is different for those in their teens, 20's and 30's, 40's and 50's. A one-size-fits-all approach is likely not to gain much traction. So where does that leave us? In the next few months, I'll be looking towards seeing how each of you views our future.

Changing subjects...

The Wisconsin Conference of the UCC held its annual meeting June 7th, 8th, & 9th. It was pretty well attended. Today, I would like to share a few highlights in this article. First, our Conference Minister Franz Rigert highlighted that the church today has unique opportunities, given that many are "...longing for belonging". And he went on to say that "We in the Church are really good at building community. The time is ripe. What's more, the Church can provide safe spaces for relationships in which we can hold diverging perspectives and honor each other in the process." Franz next took a little time to mention that even as we here in our local churches are looking at change, the Conference is also looking at changes through restructuring and reorganization that will help make Conference and Association resources more efficient and accessible. Another key point in his message was the shortage of pastors. While this is not a problem that will have a 'today' solution, there is a challenge place before us to "tap 20 new pastoral recruits in the coming two years..."

There were many other good speakers and presentations. I will place the link for the Conference Newsletter at the end of my article.

In closing, I give thanks to God for the joy of being your pastor for a while. I'm looking forward to planning and collaborating with you on what our future will look like. As an Intentional Interim Pastor, I hope

that we will take time to give thanks for all your past pastors and appropriately honor each of them. And after we have taken some time to reflect, pray, and possibly grieve, we begin the journey of moving forward and engaging with our future. I also look forward toward using all the tools on my professional toolbelt in bringing ideas, thoughts, and plans forward.

Remember that God loves each of you – and – so do I.


Stockbridge Picnic & Parade

Ebenezer UCC Church Council Minutes June 16, 2024

Members present: Mark Rusch, Don Pingel, Karen Cmejla, Brian Adamietz, Judy Mattes, Nick Kuhn and Amy Kuhn

Meeting was called to order by President Mark Rusch at 8:00 AM in the church lounge.

Prayer was led by Don Pingel.

Nick Kuhn made a motion to approve the May minutes and today's agenda. Don Pingel seconded it. Motion carried.

Brian Adamietz presented the May treasurers report:

Income: \$15,133.19 (On 5/8/24 \$7360.00 was transferred from the Memorial Fund to cover the final payment on the basement asbestos removal project. The check for this cleared on 5/13/24. April offerings were 7298.19 which was deposited on 5/01/24).

Expenses: (\$13,162.51)

Checking Account Balance: \$91,099.49

Money Market Account Balance: \$202,745.11 (\$303.36 gained in interest) Total Equity: \$293,844.60

Minus Special Giving Acct \$179,714.87 \$114,129.73 Cambridge Investments: \$70,020.72

Don Pingel questioned the entry for purchase of communion cups which mistakenly got entered to "Janitor Supplies". It was decided to move that entry to "Misc. Expense".

Nick Kuhn made a motion to accept the May treasurers report and approve the Bills List and Amy Kuhn seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: None as Pastor Kohls is still not considered our interim until July 1st.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Christian Education:

Melissa Kuhn was present and stated she is trying to add an Easter Program to the Sunday School curriculum along with the usual Christmas program. She said Shirley Lisowe has volunteered to help her out with this. Melissa also presented to the

council her ideas and plans to hold a "Family Fun Day" event on September 21st at the church which will hopefully replace our fundraising that we normally had from the ice cream social. She also stated the next Sunday School year will start on September 15th.

Karen Cmejla made a motion to accept her ideas on the "Family Fun Day" event and Judy Mattes seconded it. Motion carried.

Evangelism Committee:

On June 8th, 19 flower planters were distributed throughout the community by Vern, Adam and Ann Gasch which has been well received.

Property Committee: The project of removal of Asbestos in floor tiles of the basement floor is complete. Final payment was made. Nick Kuhn received some estimates of styles to replace the flooring, but this was tabled for a special meeting to be held next Sunday as we ran out of time this week. Ideas for painting the basement walls will also be discussed next week.

Ken Lisowe will be replacing the insulation on the basement pipes.

There was no other old business.

NEW BUSINESS:

Supply Pastors are covering services well until Rev Kohls arrives on July

1st. Rev. Dan Borchers from Cleveland is scheduled on June 23rd and 30th

with Karen Darneck from Darboy on June 16th as supply Pastors.

• Mark Rusch mentioned the steps to follow to change the controlled computer timing on the church entrance doors are located in his mailbox in the office.
